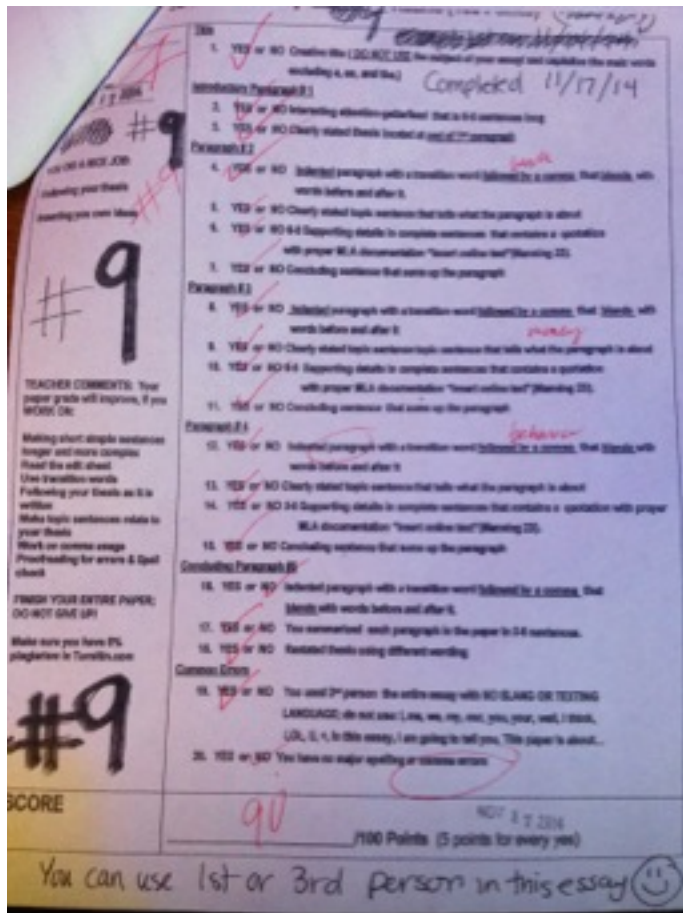

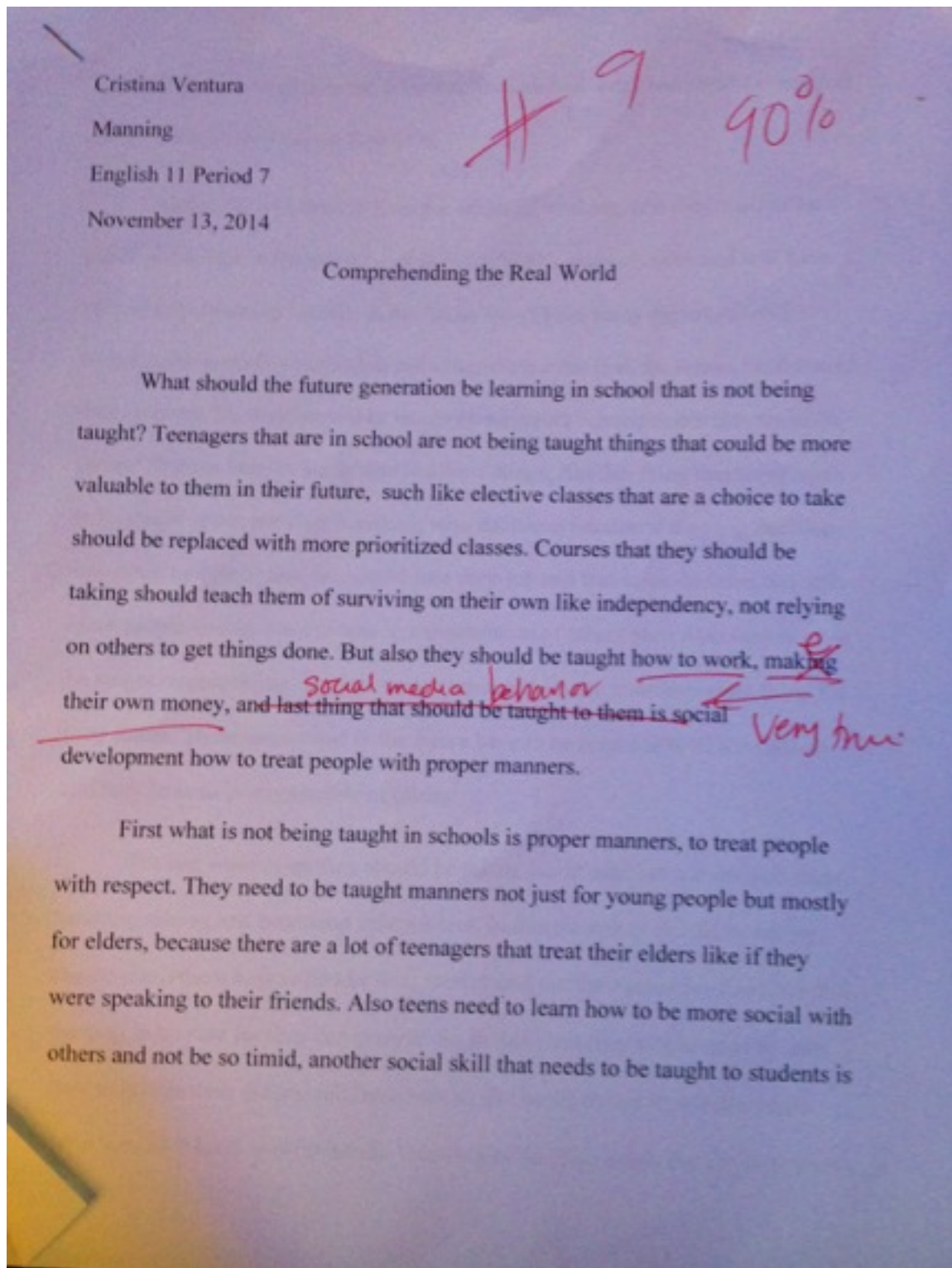
### Student Work Analysis

However, the way that my teacher assess them is very regimented. I am not sure if the rubric comes from the school or the district, but it asks for very specific things to be in the essay. One of the requirements in each section is a certain number of sentences, and another is the use of a transition word in the first sentence of each paragraph. I understand that we are trying to get these students to get into the habit of these requirements, but I think they can be restricting and harmful to the grades of students. It does not seem logical to me that the success of an essay is determined by the number of sentences and use of transition words, but those are requirements that dictate half the grade.
